Go Live:

Our theatregoing club for young people aged 15-24. GoLive is a club for 15-24 year olds and encourages young people to independently attend the theatre for as little as £7 a ticket. It's free to join and more information is available on our website.

Go Live Grads:

For ages 25-29. For an annual admin fee of £10, Go Live Grads members will receive:

- The opportunity to attend group theatre trips to a diverse selection of shows from fresh new musicals to powerful new plays per year and pay just £15 per ticket.
- Regular emails featuring more special ticket offers from other venues and all the latest news.
- The opportunity to speak, mentor and/or volunteer at one of our careers events for young people, including our annual Youth Leadership in the Arts Conference.

Kids Week offers children the opportunity to experience the magic of London theatre for free throughout the month of August.
