RECOMMENDED AGE: 8+ (babies and children under 4 will not be admitted to the venue)

CONTENT WARNINGS:

This production contains strobe and flashing lighting, loud and sudden noises, smoke effects, mild threat...and mythical creatures!

SYNOPSIS:

When New York City teenager Percy Jackson discovers that he is the half-blood son of the Greek god, Poseidon, his life takes a dramatic turn as he is plunged into a world much bigger than he could possibly have imagined.

With newly discovered powers he is unable to control, an unwanted destiny and a whole textbook's worth of mythical monsters on his trail, Percy must learn what it means to be a hero.

The future of the world hangs in the balance as Percy and his friends embark on an epic adventure that will have you on the edge of your seat.

VENUE ACCESS INFORMATION:

The Theatre auditorium has level access and there are dedicated wheelchair spaces in Row N (the back row of the auditorium which is at ground level). Please note: the rake from Row N to the stage is fairly steep and may not be suitable for vertigo sufferers. Access to aisle seats in the Theatre auditorium involves a minimum of one step.

CONTENT WARNINGS:

This production contains roller-skating on tracks close to the audience, pyrotechnics, flashing and strobe lights, haze, simulated sparks, flame & smoke effects, and loud sound effects

SYNOPSIS:

As a child's train set magically comes to life and the engines race to become the fastest in the world, Rusty the steam train has little hope of winning until he is inspired by the legend of the 'Starlight Express'.

MATILDA THE MUSICAL

VENUE: CAMBRIDGE THEATRE, EARLHAM ST, LONDON, WC2H 9HU

RECOMMENDED AGE: 6+ (babies and children under 4 will not be admitted to the venue)

CONTENT WARNINGS:

This production features flashing lights, lasers and loud sound effects. Latex balloons are popped onstage and stage haze (smoke) is used. Throughout the performance actors interact in audience spaces.

SYNOPSIS:

Matilda The Musical is the multi-award winning musical from the Royal Shakespeare Company, inspired by the beloved book by Roald Dahl.

With book by Dennis Kelly and original songs by Tim Minchin, Matilda The Musical is the story of an extraordinary little girl who, armed with a vivid imagination and a sharp mind, dares to take a stand and change her own destiny.

Winner of over 100 international awards, including 24 for Best Musical, Matilda is now the 15th Longest-Running Production in West End history.

MEAN GIRLS: THE MUSICAL

VENUE: SAVOY THEATRE, SAVOY CT, STRAND, LONDON WC2R OET

AGE RATING: 10+

Babies and children under the age of 3 are not permitted in the theatre and anyone under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult 18 years or over. The accompanying adult must be seated with the under 16.

CONTENT WARNINGS:

It includes some mature themes including bullying and commentary on body image. Includes strobe lighting.

SYNOPSIS:

Meet The Plastics – Regina, Gretchen and Karen. They rule North Shore High and will burn anyone who gets in their way. Home-schooled Cady Heron may think she knows a thing or two about survival of the fittest thanks to her zoologist mom, but high school is a whole new level of savage. When Cady devises a plan to end Regina's reign, she learns the hard way that you can't cross a queen bee without getting stung.

VENUE ACCESS INFORMATION:

The theatre has no lift and 75 steps to the Stalls, which are not recommended for patrons with limited mobility. The Dress Circle is accessible via 32 steps or street-level access from Carting Lane.

Wheelchair access is available in the Dress Circle, accommodating one wheelchair patron with a companion or two wheelchair patrons seated together. Patrons can transfer to seats in Row F (2 steps) or Row G (3 steps). Accessible toilets are on the Dress Circle level.

MY NEIGHBOUR TOTORO

VENUE: GILLIAN LYNNE THEATRE, 166 DRURY LANE, LONDON WC2B 5PW

RECOMMENDED AGE: 6+ (babies and children under 4 will not be admitted to the venue)

CONTENT WARNINGS:

This production contains live music, some loud noises, some scenes are set in a hospital with a sick parent and some very large puppets. There are pyrotechnics, smoke, and haze.

SYNOPSIS:

My Neighbour Totoro is an enchanting coming-of-age story exploring the magical fantasy world of childhood and the transformative power of imagination, as it follows one extraordinary summer in the lives of sisters Satsuki and Mei.

VENUE ACCESS INFORMATION:

The Stalls are accessed by escalator and stairs, with the Circle up two to three flights of stairs. For access customers, the Stalls auditorium is accessible via lifts and a wheelchair platform, with two dedicated wheelchair spaces and companion seats in Row P. Row S can be used for transferring from wheelchairs. Wheelchairs must be within 73cm width and 123cm length. Larger electric wheelchairs cannot enter due to lift limitations. The maximum lift capacity is 630kg (8 persons). The Dress Circle is only accessible via stairs: 114 steps from the ground floor or 24 steps using the lifts.

VENUE: APOLLO VICTORIA THEATRE

RECOMMENDED AGE: 7+ (babies and children under 5 will not be admitted to the theatre)

CONTENT WARNINGS:

Loud noises, flashing lights, smoke effects, and strobe lighting feature in the production. Explores themes of bullying and discrimination.

SYNOPSIS:

Based on the acclaimed novel by Gregory Maguire, Wicked imagines a beguiling backstory to the lives of L. Frank Baum's beloved characters, and reveals the magic that shaped the destinies of two unlikely friends on their remarkable journey to becoming Glinda The Good and the Wicked Witch of the West.

VENUE ACCESS INFORMATION:

The Apollo Victoria Theatre offers step-free access and wheelchair accommodations. There are four wheelchair positions in Row F of the Circle, accessible via two platform lifts from the Vauxhall Bridge Road entrance. Wheelchairs must meet specific size and weight limits. Patrons can transfer to theatre seats in Row F, which is accessible via lifts or 17 steps with handrails.

CLUELESS, THE MUSICAL

VENUE: TRAFALGAR THEATRE, 14 WHITEHALL, LONDON SW1A 2DY

RECOMMENDED AGE: 8+ (babies and children under 5 will not be admitted to the venue)

SYNOPSIS:

Welcome to 90s Beverly Hills, where Cher Horowitz has a heart bigger than her allowance and a unique talent of finding love for others. When awkward new girl Tai arrives in town, Cher takes on her biggest project yet – but is she matchmaking or meddling? And what about her annoying ex-stepbrother Josh who she can't stop thinking about? Suddenly, Cher's life isn't quite so perfect and – ugh! – maybe she's the one being clueless.

VENUE ACCESS INFORMATION:

Trafalgar Theatre is accessible for wheelchair users. Please note the lift only goes down to the Stalls level. The Dress Circle is only accessible via stairs.

The main entrance to the theatre is on Whitehall. The Foyer, Foyer Bar and Box Office are on street level. The pavement in front of the entrance of the venue is raised by 2 steps. You can find a flat pavement on Spring Gardens, the street parallel to Whitehall behind the theatre.

Enter the foyer step free, take the lift to the lower level, then enter the auditorium via rear Stalls Entrance A or B, depending on your seat location. The Stalls level is gently raked and the spaces for wheelchair user and companion are on the aisles in rows B and H. There are 25 steps down from the Foyer/Box Office to the Stalls Bar. You are welcome to use our lift. The Stalls Bar affords level access to the Stalls auditorium.

Our Dress Circle level is steeply raked.

RECOMMENDED AGE: 7+ (babies and children under 4 will not be admitted to the venue)

CONTENT WARNINGS:

Show includes flashing lights, strobe effects, smoke/haze and pyrotechnics throughout. More info on exact timings <u>here</u> (includes spoilers!)

SYNOPSIS:

Great Scott! It's time for "perfect musical escapism" (Metro) with the multi-award winning Back to the Future The Musical. The 1985 blockbuster film and pop culture phenomenon is electrifying audiences and critics alike.

When Marty McFly finds himself transported back to 1955 in a time machine built by the eccentric scientist Doc Brown, he accidentally changes the course of history. Now he's in a race against time to fix the present, escape the past and send himself... back to the future.

The Stalls auditorium has level access and there are two dedicated wheelchair park spaces in Row X. Any aisle seat in the Stalls can be used for customers wishing to transfer from a wheelchair into a theatre seat.

The Dress and Upper Circle levels of the auditorium can only be accessed via routes including stairs

FIRST TIME VISITING THE THEATRE?

PLEASE FIND ANSWERS TO SOME FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS BELOW TO ASSIST WITH YOUR VISIT.

Is there a dress code?

No, you are free to wear what you like and feel most comfortable in. Some people may choose to dress up, if it's a special occasion, but there is no expectation to wear anything fancy.

What time do I have to arrive?

You should aim to arrive about 30 minutes before the time listed on your ticket.

This is the time that the show starts. So, make sure you are settled and in your seat before this time. If you are late, you may not be let into the theatre.

Can I eat in the theatre?

Most theatres will not allow food bought from somewhere else to be brought in, but most will allow you to bring your own soft drinks – as long as they are in a plastic bottle. No hot food or drinks and no glass is allowed, for the safety of the other audience members.

Theatres will have a bar where you can purchase drinks and snacks.

If you are eating snacks in noisy packaging, it's a good idea to open the snacks before the show starts – otherwise they can disturb the performers on stage and your fellow audience members.

Can I take photos/videos?

You are welcome to take photos and videos before the performance starts to remember your trip to the theatre, but you must not take any once the performance starts. If you are caught using your phone or a camera at this time, a member of staff will ask you to stop. If you continue to photograph/film, you might be asked to leave.

How long is the show?

On each show page you will be able to find the running times. Most shows are divided into two halves, with a short interval (usually about 15-20 minutes long) in the middle.

The interval is your opportunity to stretch your legs, go to the toilet and get a drink or a snack. You are also very welcome to stay in your seat.

FAQS CONTINUED...

I'm scared of heights, will I be very high up?

Some theatres do have very steep steps, and the seats can be quite high up, so when booking look for seats that are closer to the stage. Rows in theatres are usually ordered alphabetically with A being the row closest to the stage and Z being the row furthest away. If you don't like heights, try to book seats in the stalls which are on the ground level.

What are the different levels in the theatre?

- Stalls: These are the seats on the ground level directly in front of the stage.
- First Circle / Dress Circle: This is the first floor of seating above the stalls.
- Second Circle / Grand Circle: This is the second floor of seating
- Balcony: This is usually the highest level of seating.

Can I bring my baby/toddler to the theatre?

Each theatre and show allows different ages to attend. You can find the age recommendation in the show information. Most theatres do not allow children under 5 to attend and do not allow babies.

I need to book a wheelchair space, or have specific access queries

GLOSSARY

The following glossary may help you understand some of the terms that are commonly used in theatres.

Running Time: This is how long the show, or each act of a show, will last. You can find these running times on the info page for each show.

Interval: This is a short break in the middle of a show where you are welcome to leave the auditorium. This can be a good time to stretch your legs, go to the toilet, get a drink or a snack. If you would rather stay in your seat that is okay as well.

Foyer: The waiting area at the entrance of the theatre.

Auditorium: The seating area in front of the stage where audience sit and watch the performance.

E-Ticket: A ticket is a document with details such as the name, time and date of the show you are seeing and where you are sitting. To gain entry to the theatre you will need to show this document to a member of Front of House Staff.

Most theatres will provide the ticket as an e-ticket, which is an online version and will be emailed to the person who bought the tickets to show and can be shown to staff on a mobile phone/tablet or printed off.

Some theatres will send you the ticket just after you have ordered, some will send a few days before the performance – so please keep an eye on your emails and check the booking policy when you book.

Seat Number: Each seat at the theatre has a specific number and your ticket will tell you what seat number you will be sitting in. Your ticket will show a letter and a number, for example "A5". The letter is to tell you what row you are in, and the number is to tell you which seat you are in.

You can find which row is which by looking at the letters on the floor on the end of each row and you can find the number by looking at the number on the seat. An usher will be very happy to help you find your seat.

Usher or Front of House Staff: These are staff members who are placed throughout the theatre (often at the door of the auditorium). They are there to check everyone's ticket, help show the audience to their seat and provide any help you may need. Sometimes these staff members will be called Ushers or Front of House Staff – both names mean the same thing.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Taking part in Family First Nights (FFN is subject to the following terms and conditions)

- 1. Any cancellations made after the tickets have been booked with the theatre are still liable to be paid for.
- 2. You must not share the ticket booking link with any friends or families. If we find that you have shared the link we reserve the right to cancel your booking.
- 3. Families may only book up to 8 tickets for ONE performance only. If duplicate bookings are identified Go Live reserves the right to cancel your booking.
- 4. At least half of the booking must include young people aged 6 17 (or up to age 25 for young people with SEND), unless you are a two parent family with one child.
- 5. Someone in your party must be aged 18 or over.
- 6. We have a limited allocation of tickets for each performance and they will be allocated first come, first served. We strongly advise that you book quickly to avoid disappointment. All tickets and prices are strictly subject to availability.
- 7. Children under 3 will not be admitted to most London theatres, unless stated otherwise on the booking page.
- 8. All information provided will be kept securely and will only be used in line with Go Live's Privacy Policy.
- 9. Families must be referred through a referring organisation.
- 10. Families must not have previously taken part in Family First Nights, unless they are a foster family who are taking new children to the theatre (please make sure this is noted on the families application).
- 11. Go Live are not able to take applications from any staff members of partner organisations.
